After 50 years Glounthaune wins a Tidy Towns Bronze Medal

There were celebrations in Glounthaune at the recent ceremony held at Croke Park when we achieved national recognition with the award of a bronze medal. A gap of over 50 years since our last medal award! A bronze medal is awarded to communities who are within 20 points of the outright national winner which this year was Abbeyleigh.

Michael Power, Angela Reidy and Terry Fleming attended the ceremony to collect the award from Minister Heather Humphries TD together with a €500 cash award.

An astounding 13 additional points were awarded to Glounthaune this year and we achieved a total of 357 points. This is a tribute to the hard work by everybody in the community over many years. Take a bow everyone!

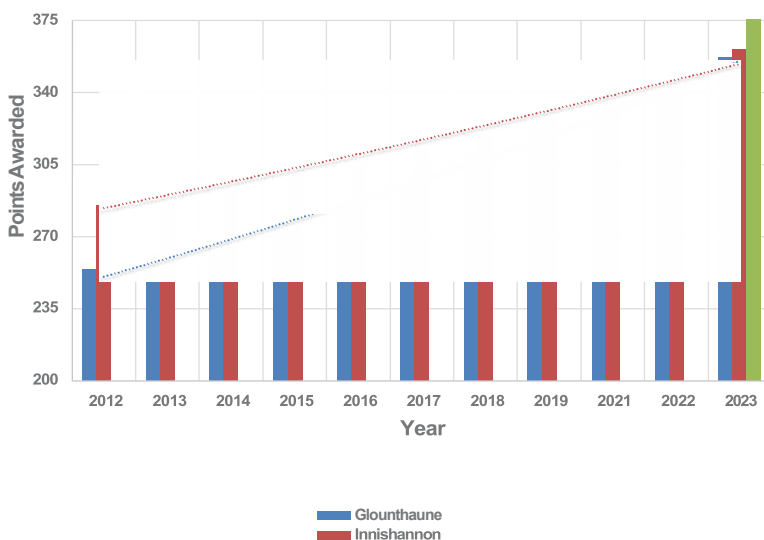
We have historically tracked and benchmarked our performance with Innishannon, who have for many years headed the table for Villages in South Cork -- they outscored us this year winning an extra 16 points as they recovered from Covid. but it was a matter of a point here and a point there.

Looking at our progress over the past 10 years to be within 20 points of the overall national winner Abbeyleigh (376 points) puts us in striking distance of national recognition!

So where are the differences between Glounthaune, Innishannon and Abbeyleix the national winner in Tidy Towns scoring for 2023? We’ve attempted to benchmark and show where we are winners and losers. The Table below shows the actual scores achieved per category and the bar graph is a useful visual representation.

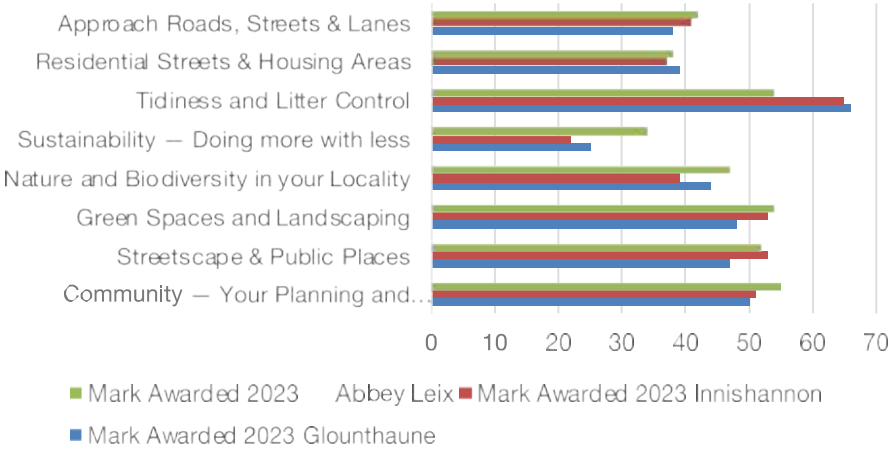
We benchmark well in Tidiness and Litter Control, and Residential Streets and Housing Areas categories where Glounthaune is top dog!

We lag in Sustainability -- Doing More with Less, where Abbeyleix outscores us by a whole 9 points. We also lag in Community Involvement, Street Scrapes and Public Spaces, and Approach Roads, Streets and Lanes.

This mantle was taken up by Conor O'Brien followed by Angela Reidy who put in stalwart shifts before they retired (partially). Ailbe Ryan our current Chairman, aided by the committee, is continuing the great foundations established over the last decade -- it is clear however we do need more help.

TWO OCTOBER FLOOD EVENTS IN GLOUNTHAUNE

October was certainly a wet and dreary month. The Met Éireann monthly statement reports that the highest percentage of monthly rainfall values was 222% at Roche's Point, Co Cork and Cork Airport, Co Cork (monthly rainfall total of 242.1 mm and 307.2 mm) respectively. Monthly rainfall totals were highest at Cork Airport with 307.2 mm (222% of its long-term average), its highest October rainfall on record and its third highest overall monthly rainfall behind December 2015 and January 1974. The month's wettest day was also recorded at Cork Airport with 55.6 mm on Wednesday 18th (its highest daily fall for October since 1995).

All of this rainfall had real consequences for Glanmire, Midleton and East Cork with terrible flooding experienced. In Glounthaune, Storm Babet brought flooding to the roads and several cars were damaged by flood waters. The hill at the Church sustained damage as the drains could not cope with the amount of stormwater entering the drain system.

Another event occurred on bank holiday Monday 30th October. A heavy but short downpour led to heavy runoff coming down from the steep hillsides above Glounthaune.

Rural pluvial flooding produces sheet flow of water over surfaces and in gullies. The surface flow gathers volume and velocity on hill slopes and can gather sufficient momentum to wash away walls, cause structural damage, scour fields of soil, stones and crops and carry these with the water to lower urban settlements, or into any landscape depressions where water may pond to considerable depth.

A characteristic of this type of flooding is the speed of the event, which can be termed a flash flood.

A month of high rainfall likely means that the water table is very high and agricultural lands have very little absorption capacity.

So pay attention to these short intense rain events, and if you must drive shortly afterwards, drive with caution.

Caution when Driving in Flooded Areas

Here is some useful advice that should be shared with all drivers particularly young or novice drivers (for full article <https://www.allianz.ie/blog/your-car/tips-for-driving-in-flooded-areas-ireland.html>).

First, a simple test: DON'T drive if you can't identify the highest path through flood water; or if you aren't familiar enough with the area to gauge how deep the water is. As a general hint, the centre of the road could have the highest surface, as areas beside kerbs tend to have drains fitted.

The AA advises that you should never drive through any more than 10 centimetres (four inches) of moving water, or 15 centimetres (six inches) of standing water. Driving through levels higher than this increases the risk of aquaplaning, where your tyres lose their grip on the road and your vehicle starts skidding along the surface.

Always drive slowly and steadily – as one of the biggest motoring dangers during floods is the possibility that you could create waves which may then flow back under your bonnet.

By the same logic, always try to avoid driving through flood waters if there is traffic coming in the opposite direction – as there is the possibility that the waves caused by oncoming traffic can flood your engine.

I am here to offer some helpful advice as we head into those cold and busy Winter months.

Consider a coat/jacket for small dogs and sighthounds (Greyhounds/Lurchers) on those cold days!

Be aware that outdoor cats may hide in car engines in chilly weather to warm up. Always listen out for noises before you drive!

Anti-freeze is highly Toxic to our pets so if using, please use carefully.

With Christmas coming, make sure to keep your pets away from chocolates and other foods that are commonly used at this time of year like raisins for the Christmas cake, as well as things like onions for stuffing and much more.

If your pet is quite anxious with fireworks, consider calming agents for them to get through New Years Eve relaxed and comfortable.

Continue with anti-parasitic treatments into the Winter months. Unfortunately fleas are not just a Summertime issue!

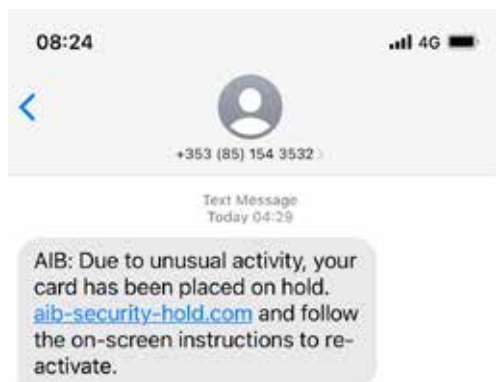
Tech Corner



Internet and Text Message Scams: How to Protect Yourself and Reduce the Risk.

Internet and text message scams are fraudulent schemes that use online platforms or mobile devices to trick people into giving money or personal information. These scams can take various forms, such as fake emails, phone calls, texts, websites, or online ads and social media posts. They may pretend to be from individuals, legitimate companies, government departments such as the HSE or the Revenue Commissioners or utility companies like Irish Water and An Post, and offer rewards, prizes, discounts, refunds, or assistance. They may also threaten to cause harm, legal action, account suspension or service interruption if the victim does not comply. Unfortunately, these scams have been increasing significantly in recent years, and have become more sophisticated, in many cases referring to recent events such as flooding due to Storm Babet or humanitarian crises occurring in Gaza or Ukraine. A recent estimate puts the cost to Irish individuals and businesses at more than €300 million per year, with €85 million fraudulently taken from people in Ireland in 2022. Here are some recent examples, with some tips to help avoid becoming a victim to internet and SMS scams.

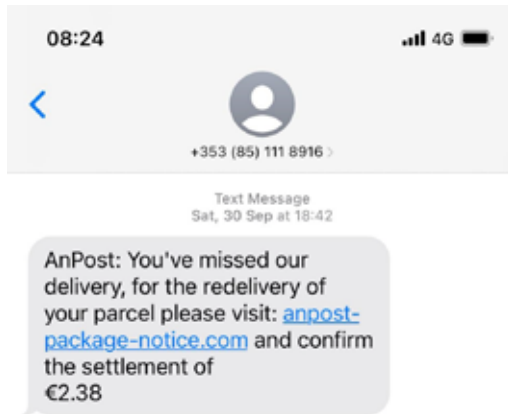


DON'T CLICK THE LINK - IT'S A SCAM !!!

Fake text message example - never click on links or open attachment in suspicious messages.

Do not respond to messages that offer too good to be true deals, prizes, refunds, or assistance.

Fraudsters are sending people fake messages pretending to be from a member of their family with a lost or damaged phone who needs access to money.



DON'T CLICK THE LINK - IT'S A FAKE !!!

Clicking on fake links like this one will lead to fraud sites trying to collect banking or credit card details.

Do not give out your personal details, passwords, PINs, bank accounts, or card numbers to anyone you do not know or trust.

Be wary of unsolicited emails, calls, or texts that ask for money or personal information.

Never allow anyone to remotely access your computer or device without verifying their identity and purpose.

Do not buy anything from websites that do not have secure payment methods (look for https:// in the address bar and a padlock icon).

Do some research before making an online purchase or investment decision and check the reviews and ratings of the seller or company.

Contact your bank, service provider, or government agency directly if you receive any suspicious messages claiming to be from them.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: SOCIAL WELFARE SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WHO LIVE ALONE

Did you know that there is an extra payment for people on social welfare payments who are living alone? It is a payment called the Living Alone Increase which is paid to people on certain social welfare payments who live alone.

How does one qualify for a Living Alone Increase?

If you are 66 years or over and live alone, you will qualify if you are getting one of the following payments

- State Pension (Contributory)
- State Pension (Non-Contributory)
- Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's (Contributory) Pension
- Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's (Non-Contributory) Pension
- Widow's/Widower's Pension under the Occupational Injuries Benefit Scheme
- Incapacity Supplement under the Occupational Injuries Benefit Scheme
- Deserted Wife's Benefit

You will also qualify if you are under 66, live alone and are getting Disability Allowance, Invalidity Pension, Incapacity Supplement or Blind Pension.

I live in an extension of my daughter's home. Do I qualify for the living alone increase?

To get the increase in your payment you must live completely alone. However, there are some exceptions.

If you are living in an extension of a family member's home, for example, in a granny flat, you can qualify for the increase if you can show that you have facilities to cook and eat alone. You must also have your own living/dining and sleeping accommodation.

People who live in sheltered accommodation may qualify if they are regarded as living independently within the institution. The Department of Social Protection provides a list of hostels/homes where Living Alone Increase is payable. You will not qualify if you share dormitory accommodation with others, or have round-the clock supervision or nursing care.

Can you get the living alone increase if you live in a nursing home?

People who live in nursing homes will not qualify as they cannot be regarded as living completely or mainly alone.

If I am getting the living alone increase, can anyone stay overnight with me?

You can qualify as living alone, if you are aged or infirm and have a friend or relative to stay for security reasons at night-time only. The friend or relative must not contribute to the household financially.

You can also qualify if you live alone during the day but stay with relatives or friends at night or if you live alone during the week but have a relative to stay at the weekend (the living alone condition is satisfied as long as the relative has a permanent home address elsewhere).

Are there any other exceptional situations where I may qualify for the living alone increase?

You would be eligible to claim the living alone increase if you:

- Allow a person(s) who is not an employee or not an immediate family member to stay in your home rent free and you would be living alone, but for that person.
- Are renting for at least 28 consecutive days to a person(s) who is not an employee or not an immediate family member and you would be living alone, but for that person.
- Are renting for at least 28 consecutive days to a person(s) from Ukraine covered by the Temporary Protection Directive and you would be living alone, but for that person.
- Live alone but occasionally take in paying guests (for example, during a local festival). However, if you run a bed and breakfast business (even for part of the year) you will not qualify.

How do I qualify for the Telephone Support Allowance?

If you're getting the Living Alone Increase together with the Fuel Allowance, you will automatically qualify for a Telephone Support Allowance of €2.50 per week. It is paid separately from your primary payment and is intended to help with the cost of communications and/or a home alert system. As this allowance is paid automatically to people who qualify, you do not need to apply for it.

What is the current rate of Living Alone Increase?

Currently (2023) the living alone increase is €22 per week

How do I apply for a Living Alone Increase?

You should complete the Living Alone Increase application form, which you can get from your local Social Welfare office or Citizens Information Centre. You should send the completed form to the section of the Department of Social Protection that pays your main pension or benefit.

You can contact your local Citizens Information Centre for help with completing the form.

GLOUNTHAUNE POPULATION HITS AN ALL-TIME HIGH OF 2055 PEOPLE

Astonishing Growth of 43%

The Central Statistics Office has released refined data from Census 2022, which allows us to calculate the current population of Glounthaune at now over 2000!

Our population at Census 2016 was 1440, so this means Glounthaune has grown by an astonishing 43% in the intercensal period.

This puts Glounthaune strongly ahead of Watergrasshill, which had a population surge of 37%. However, as Glounthaune is not a "census settlement" it has been included in the Cork City urban area boundary. This means we have become "invisible" to anyone seeking information about Cork County towns.

Various news articles published in national papers including the Irish Times, have listed Watergrasshill as the fastest growing Cork County town, a town which we can now put into second place!!

The growth for Cork City and county was 8% over the period, so we can see what an exceptional growth level has been recorded.

Glounthaune is having a baby boom!

The population data shows that Glounthaune is now home to 164 children aged 4 and under. This is one of the three largest age category cohort along with 35-39 year-olds (165 no.) and 40-44 year olds (163 no.).

And we continue to grow, given that the Cedars estate and Harpers Creek have both expanded since the data was collected in April 2022, you may well add another one or two hundred to that figure!

Some findings from Census 2022

Glounthaune

A place for young families, with the highest proportion of families in Glounthaune having a youngest child aged 4 or under.

119 families had a youngest child aged 4 or under

61 families had a youngest child between 5 to 9 years old. 55 families had a youngest child aged between 10 and 14. 57 families had a youngest child aged 15 to 19.

106 families had a youngest child aged 20 and over.

Primary Economic Status of persons aged 15 and over.

55% are at Work.

18% are retired.

12% are students.

8% look after the family/home.

3% are unable to work due to long-term illness or disability. 1.5% are short-term unemployed.

1% are long-term unemployed.

We Volunteer

Glounthaune registered 366 volunteers in Census 2022, each one working to keep our clubs and community thriving.

1 year before census day, 145 people were living elsewhere, with 89 living elsewhere in County Cork, 17 living elsewhere in Ireland and 39 living outside Ireland.

Census 2022 recorded high levels of self-reported "Very Good Health".

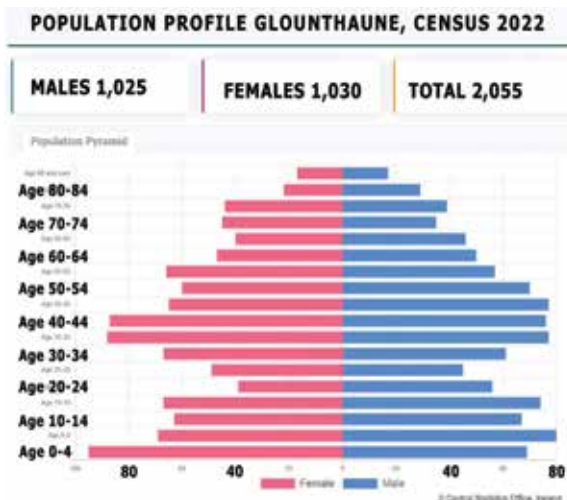

Construction work has started on a new platform at Cork's Kent Station that will allow high frequency commuter trains to run direct from Mallow to Midleton or Cobh.

The **new platform** will significantly increase passenger capacity and eventually lead to a train every 10 minutes in each direction from Glounthaune Station. All this is happening due to the Cork Metropolitan Area Transport Strategy (CMATS). CMATS implementation will enable up to 2,500 passengers per hour to move in and out of Cork.

The Midleton branch line will go from the present **single-track to full two-track service**. The total cost is estimated to be €245m. John Craddock Ltd. is the main contractor for the new platform.

Work on the refurbishment of the **Little Island** station is continuing with the overhead bridge and lift nearing completion.

Recipe Corner

Turkey Recipe



Ingredients for the Turkey Brining

- 5 ½ kg Turkey
- 6 Lt Water (approx.)
- 1 Large Orange (or 2 small oranges quartered)
- 1 tbsp Caraway seeds
- 250g Maldon Salt (Dunnes/Tesco) (or 125g Table Salt)
- 4 Cloves
- 1 Cinnamon Stick
- 3 tbsp Tablespoons Black Pepper Corns
- 2 tbsp allspice berries
- 1 Bouquet Garni
- 4 star anise
- 2 tbsp White Mustard seeds
- 200g Sugar
- 2 Onions (quartered)
- 4 tbsp Maple Syrup & Runny Honey
- 1 Bunch of fresh parsley (stalks)
- 1 x 6cm piece of Fresh root ginger (cut into 6 slices)

Basting Glaze:

- 75g Goose Fat or Butter
- 3 tbsp Maple Syrup

A delicious juicy turkey recipe



Instructions:

- Put the water into a large pot (large enough to fit Turkey). Squeeze the juice from orange into the water and add the husks in, then add all the other ingredients, stirring to combine the salt, sugar, syrup and runny honey.
- Remove any string or trussing from the Turkey, shake it free. Remove the giblets (if not done already) and put them in the fridge for the gravy. Add Turkey to the liquid in pot and top up with more water if it is not completely submerged.
- Keep the pot covered in a cold place overnight or for up to a day or two before you cook it. Remember to take the Turkey out of the liquid and wipe dry with kitchen paper, wait at least 1-2 hours before you cook in oven.
- **Preheat the oven to 200C or gas mark 6/400F**
- Melt the goose fat or butter and maple syrup together slowly over a low heat. Paint the turkey with the glaze before roasting in the oven, and baste periodically throughout the cooking time.
- **Roast for 2 1/2hrs or 24mins per kg.**
To check the progress of cooking, pierce the turkey with a sharp knife where the body meets the leg. If juices run clear, it's cooked; if still pink, cook for longer until the juices run clear. You can also use a meat thermometer.
- When cooked remove Turkey from the oven, and let it sit, cover with foil for 20 - 40mins or longer.
